In 2004, U.S. residents age 12 or older experienced approximately 24 million crimes, according to findings from the National Crime Victimization Survey. 18.6 million were property crimes. 5.2 million were crimes of violence.



Victims experienced 223,290 rapes and sexual assaults in 2003, and 4.6 million physical assaults.

The United States government spends more than \$50 billion on the "war on drugs" and spends even more on the enforcement other victimless crimes.

The government could instead put that money towards stopping victimizers and protecting Americans from victimization. Or, the government could give the money back to the tax-payers to pay for their own self-defense or other needs.

About 25% of inmates in the United States are non-violent drug offenders.

Over-crowding leads to the early release of violent criminals and other victimizers.

The United States could stop jailing people for victimless crimes such as drugs, and instead jail victimizers such as rapists, murders, kidnappers, and thieves.
